Smith County Lime Pit

Smith County MS

Limit: 40

Registration Required (Link is below)

Fee: None

TRIP: The Smith County Lime Pit is an Early Oligocene marine deposit of the Vicksburg group. It consists largely of fossiliferous limestones and clays. In decreasing age (and superposition) they are the Bucatunna Clay, Glendon Limestone, softer Marianna Limestone, and often fossil-rich residue of the Mint Spring Marl. It is an active agricultural limestone quarry, so please be mindful of the safety rules below and as reviewed on site by the field trip leaders.

COLLECTING: At this site, participants can collect a variety of shark teeth, mollusks (scallop & oyster shells, moldic gastropods & bivalves), echinoids like sand dollars and sea urchins, crabs, bryozoans, and other marine fossils.

BRING: Lunch, snacks, and water. Bucket, backpack, small containers for shark teeth and other small specimens, foil or tissue papers for wrapping fragile specimens, paper towels, handwipes, hat, sunscreen, bug spray, gloves, and safety glasses. Many of the fossils are on the surface, but you will also want to bring something for prying like a screwdriver, a chisel, and rock hammer. Wear sturdy shoes like hiking boots or mud boots. The site can be muddy and have pools of water. When it is very sunny, sunglasses help relieve the eyes from the glare off the white limestone. There is collecting on the flats, but the quarry is rocky. You can climb over some of the rocks or take a path around to reach some of the higher levels. Plan on carrying your gear from the parking area, maybe 200 ft or so.

REQUIREMENTS: Participants are expected to stay within the confines of the excavation site. No children under the age of 13 are allowed at the site. No pets please! The owner/operator may be present, so let's be on our best behavior.

TERRAIN/SPECIAL CONDITIONS: Parking is limited, especially if the site is muddy.

Please consider carpooling for the trip or at least from your hotels (you can sign up for carpooling below). Also, we are hoping to secure a site in the town of Bay Springs

where we can park some vehicles so we can carpool to the site from there. Participants need to be aware of snakes and spiders while in the rocky quarry. No venomous snakes have been sighted here, but there may be an occasional Black Widow spider. Cell phone service can be spotty.

FEE: None.

REGISTRATION: Click [here](#) to fill out a registration form. If you register and are unable to attend the trip, **please be considerate** to your fellow rockhounds and let us know as soon as possible so someone on a potential waiting list can take your slot(s).

CHILDREN: Only children **13 or older** are allowed in this quarry. There are some high rock faces, and a water filled quarry pit.

PETS: No pets allowed.

FACILITIES: No facilities at the site, but the town of Bay Springs, MS, is not more than 10 minutes away.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Lodging available in the Pearl/Brandon, MS area, Meridian, MS, Hattiesburg, MS, or Laurel MS.

DIRECTIONS AND WHERE TO MEET: Registered participants will be sent a confirmation email with directions and meeting place details.

CARPOOLING: The registration form has a place for you to indicate if you **need** a ride; if you can **offer** a ride; or if you would like to **drive or share** a carpool ride. If you choose any of these options, your name, email address, and club name will be shared with other members who also choose one of the options. Then, you can communicate with one another to arrange carpools.
